

MOUNTING INSTRUCTIONS

Mounting Directly to your Bow:

1. Position reel over sight holes so trigger can be easily operated with index finger of bow hand and attach with mounting screws provided. Two 1/4" spacers and longer screws are provided for use on bows with offset risers. Use our optional Dovetail Mounting kit for perfect adjustment and our Offset Sight kit for more accurate shots.

2. The aluminum mount plate can be drilled or cut to fit special applications.

Traditional Bows:

Use our "Traditional" Mounting Bracket (see parts list #107) to mount the Retriever directly to your Traditional bow without drilling. This system consists of a metal bracket that is strapped to your bow with rubber straps. The straps protect the bow from contact with the metal plate and securely fasten the Retriever.



Operating Instructions for Models 310 & 311

Line:

- 1 ***The Retriever works best when the line is wet.*** Hand toss your arrow into the water to wet the line.
- 2 ***From transporting and handling new and old reels, the line may be tangled on the first shot.*** On every outing, before shooting, *hand toss* your arrow into the water to wet the line and remove any tangles.
- 3 ***New line may be slightly twisted.*** If twisted line is a problem, cut off knot, pull all line out across open area, drag line while retrieving, and repeat until line is twist free.
- 4 ***Arrow fletching*** causes rotation and twists line. Remove fletching from arrow.
- 5 ***Your Retriever should operate very freely.*** If there is any binding or misfeeding, see adjustment instructions.
- 6 ***The Retriever holds approximately 35 yards of 130# braided dacron line.*** We do not recommend substituting other line unless tested by AMS.

Shooting:

There are no buttons to push before the shot. Just Draw, Aim and Shoot. To retrieve arrow, pull and hold trigger and turn handle. Trigger tension should be light. Relax trigger tension until line slips, then increase just enough to stop slipping.

Fighting Fish:

The most exciting way to fight your fish is by taking the line hand over hand.
NOTE: The Retriever is designed to have ZERO DRAG when shooting. It does not allow an adjustable fighting drag, but you can control line release using your trigger finger. With a little practice, you can fight your fish by pumping your bow, taking up slack line on the down stroke.
